## Animal Profiles.

### What is an animal profile?

- ❖ An animal profile is a flyer advertising an animal and informing potential adopters about the animal.
- ❖ Some things that were included are their age, gender, personality, photos, and other general information.

### Purpose:

- ❖ To increase the number of adoptions, which was successful.
- ❖ To increase exposure of the animals to the public.
- ❖ To get to know our animals, so we can better inform the public about them when talking to potential adopters.

### How?

- ❖ Hanging the animal profiles at local businesses, such as Tractor Supply, PetSmart, Petco, etc.

## Renovating the shelter.

On the weekends I cared for the animals and cleaned their cages, but during the week I spent a lot of time improving the shelter. I had several mini-projects during this time.

### Mini-Projects:

- ❖ Deep cleaning and organizing the feed room, isolation closet, bathroom, panther house, and isolation.
- ❖ Sorting and organizing all donations.
- ❖ Organizing and sorting feed shelves.
- ❖ Putting the lobby and adoption room furniture together.
- ❖ Marking holes in the fence and putting slats in the fence.
- ❖ Preparing the adoption room for new cat housing.

## How I fundraised.

### Raffle:

The major fundraiser I did for the shelter was a raffle. The raffle generated \$480, and all the prizes were donated from local businesses. These included gift cards, dog toys, and more. Tickets were sold for ten days and then winners were randomly drawn on Radford Animal Shelter Facebook live.

### Amazon Wish List:

I helped the shelter put together an amazon wish list. Numerous donations were sent through this. The public contributed greatly to the needs of the shelter including everything from food to lights to heating pads.

### Donations:

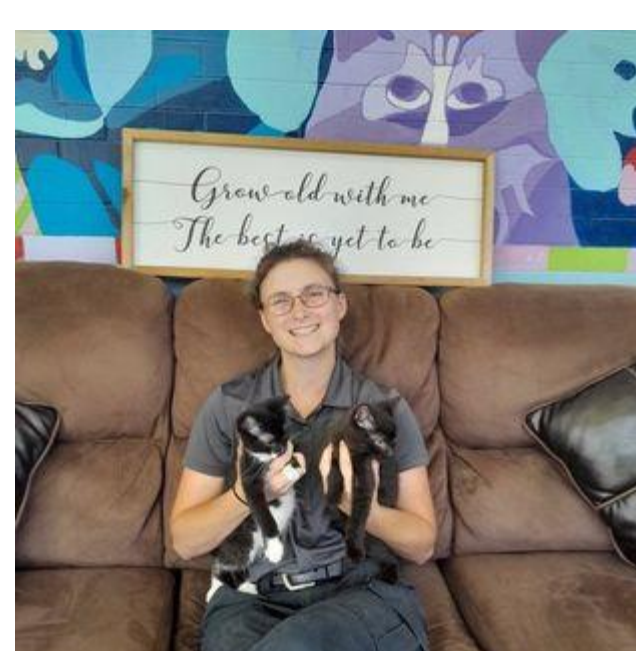
I collected donations from local businesses such as Tractor Supply and Petco. These included mostly food and animal enrichment items.

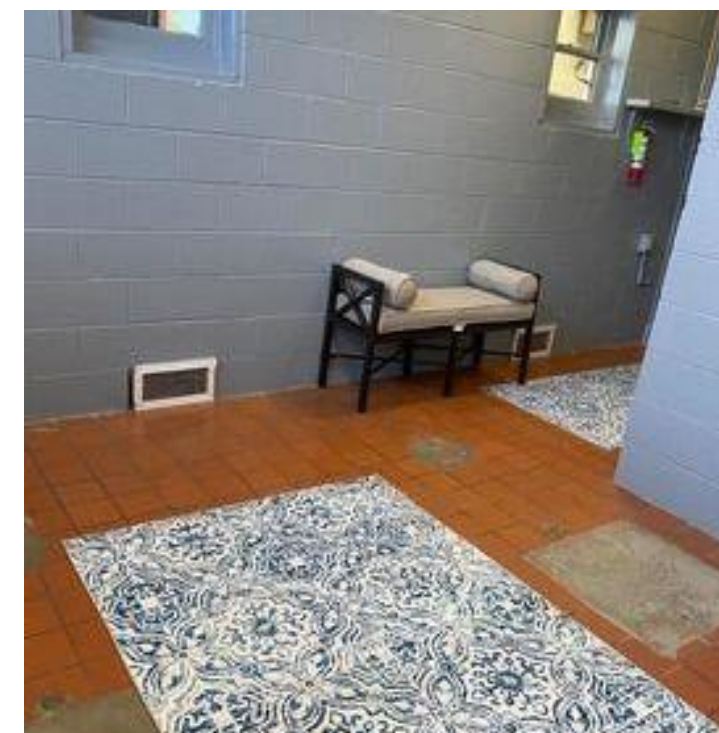

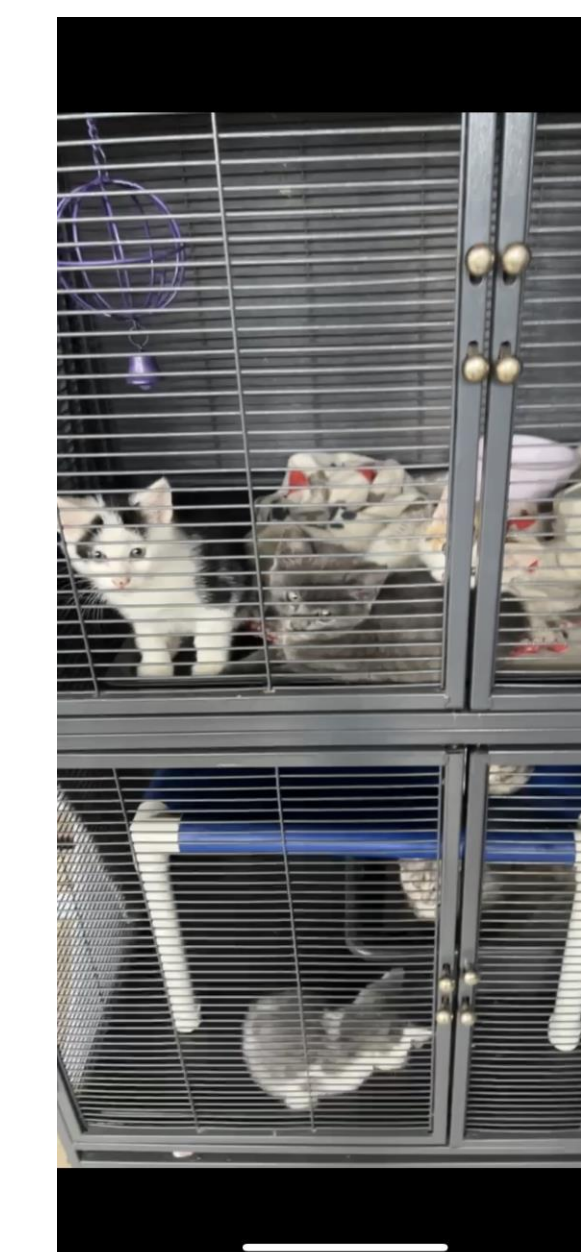
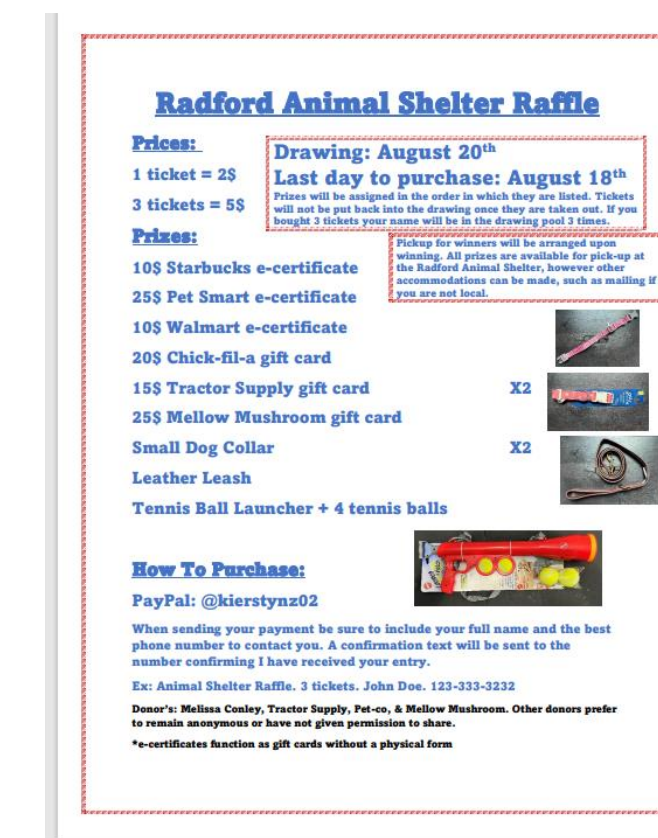
New cat adoption room.
